2.1. Recommended language skills

Language of Instruction:

Greek is the official language of instruction at CUT.

The Department of Communication and Internet Studies offers an English Speaking semester (during spring) available to all Erasmus Students.

The application period is open as on February 3rd until the 8th of April 2016 (late admissions accepted until 27th May 2016).



Other CUT Departments may offer bibliography, assignments, tutorials and exams in English for certain courses that are pre-agreed with the academics in the relevant departments.

During Fall and Spring Semester:

Greek and also other language courses are available at the University's Language Center.

3.1. Grading system

Program Requirements: The grading system is numeric from 0 to 10 rounded to the nearest half unit and 5 is the passing grade. A student must satisfy the program requirements as described in the University's prospectus corresponding to the year of entry:

For each course, the number of credits is multiplied by the numerical value of the ordinal grade received to obtain the Grade Points:

(Number of ECTS) X (Numerical (European) Value of the Ordinal Grade) = Grade Points

Then, calculate the semester grade point average by dividing the sum of grade points by the sum of the semester credits:(Sum of Grade Points) / (Sum of Semester Credits) = Semester Grade Point Average
